Stewart, who lives in Amherst, is a retired teacher and has traveled extensively in Latin America, most recently a 2017 birding tour in Brazil. The Pantanal region is said to be the largest tropical wetland area in the world. His program will take you on a visual tour of this beautiful region.

Founder and past president of Ohio Wetlands Association (OWA), Stewart now serves as the board secretary and director of communications. He is also a 2003 recipient of a Black River Audubon Society Hog Island scholarship.
